

  - To witness firsthand the issues prevalent in the criminal justice system, fostering a sense of social responsibility and motivating them to work towards positive changes.
- Usefulness: Students get a chance to interact with inmates, correctional officers, and legal
  professionals, they gain a deeper understanding of how the law operates in practice as
  well as to witness the complexities and challenges of the criminal justice system.
- Expected Outcome- The expected outcome of the program was to get students practical knowledge about prisons and jails, and issues pertaining to it.


## SUMMARY OF THE EVENT

The visit to Yerwada Central Jail, Pune was an educational and informative field trip to gain insights into the prison and jail administration in India. A total of 47 students reported for the visit at Pune.

The students were introduced to the officers along with their ranks and positions who shed light on the various aspects of the jail. The female students were escorted to the female prison, separate from the main jail premises, where the rest of the students were taken on a tour. Before entering the premises, the visitors were scrutinized for security purposes.

The various aspects of the jail premises were explored by students under the guidance of the ussigned personnel. The following details were procured as part of the tour:

The main juil premises is spread over 70 acres whereas the whole central juil area is 550 acres. There are 300 security personnels always guarding the jail. Although has the capacity of holding 2500 inmates, the current statistics of inmates present in the jail were 6600. Those accused were kept separate from undertrial prisoners. They were identified with colored bands tied on the arm, red for those who attempted





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to abscord from the jail and yellow for other convicts. The undertrials were given the provision of being in their civil clothes (either received from their houses or given by the prison administration).

The prisoners are conferred the right to work and occupation and are givenwages for their work and receive Ba. 62, 75, 78, depending on the kind of work done. These wages are calculated on daily wages. Undertolal prisoners are not allowed to involve themselves in any kind of labor work. However, all prisoners get an opportunity to pursue their graduation and postgraduation by entitling with the Indira Gandhi National Open University (KGNOU) and Yaubwantrao Chavan Mahanahtra Open University (YCMOU).

Other than the cells, there were kitchen urea, broughtal with doctor available 24s7, indoor playing room, video conferencing room, and an open ground. There was a separate provision for holding juveniles, i.e., those under 18 years of age.

The inmates get an opportunity to speak with their family members and legal counsel through video conference (through Ziom and Google Mecconce in a week for 10-20 minutes. There were in all 12 morns for this purpose. This information was shared by Constable Subhash Mohan Nilkant. Police Superintendent Balasoheb Sidankhe informed the students that there was a provision for physical meeting as well. The undertrials were allowed to meet once a week whereas convicts could get an opportunity once in 15 days.

The female prison have separate compounds for convicts and undertrials. Each compound had housing cells, kitchen and a place The women immues have a provision to work for themselves for their sustenance through handlwork, i.e., diya making, fire sparklers, and small toys which are solid in the market.

The students had an insightful experience in learning about the central jail and returned home with new learnings for the day.



Further, he talked about the major problem arising in families which create disputes. Further continuing he added, how the fundamental rights pluy major role in delivering justice. She then spoke about the transparency that is maintained in the legal proceedings because of this law, and continued to talk about the awards and punishment that were provided by the cases in (Domestic Violence).





THAKUR RAMNARAYAN COLLEGE OF LAW organized a court visit on 9th August 2019. The purpose of the visit was to understand the working of a court, the nature of duties of the judicial officers. The visit was to help us understand the role of court in dispensing justice in any case, the role of prosecutors in a case, the way cases proceed in a court, the way judges, prosecutors and defense lawyers handle the case, the relationship of the prosecutors and the police. This gave us an opportunity to understand the actual need of co-ordination in the four pillars of the criminal justice system.

- To understand the working of a court and organization of Public Prosecutor's office
- The nature of duties of the judicial officers.
- To help us understand the role of court in dispensing justice in any case
- · Filing of charge sheet
- To observe how Public Prosecutor is opening cases
- Role of Public Prosecutor on the point of framing charge
- Role of Public Prosecutor in recording statement of witness
- Role of Public Prosecutor in cross examination
- Role of Public Prosecutor in recording the statement of Investigating Officer and expert.



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- Role of Public Prosecutor in submitting charge sheet
- To understand how processes are issued and delivered
- To understand the role of a court clerk.

All the students were told to report at 10:00 a.m. As, we reached the court we had to go through the security checking. The security at the entrance was tight. We had to pass through a metal detector and our bags were passed through a screener. Anything suspicious was checked. There were hundreds of ordinary people like as talking among themselves and with lawyers. Some were getting their case papers typed. While everyone was busy only we seemed a bit lost, literally and figuratively.

We were divided into 4 groups and entered into respective court rooms and quietly sat down on the audience bench. After all, it was the highest seat of law, and we were strictly instructed to maintain decorum. We were armsed to see dozens of advocates moving to and fro, while some just sitting waiting for their turn.

After that, we were showed and explained how the court actually functions. To begin with, is the Affirmation Department where a where a plaintiff has to first file a case, known as a 'civil suit'. Here, our case papers have to be signed in front of a court officer, to confirm that it is us who are filing the suit. Filing the criminal cases is taken care by the police.

From there, the case papers are passed to the Lodging or Board Department. The officers there, known as associates of judges, verify the papers and see if anything objectionable is to be deleted from the papers. Once the mistakes are rectified, a 'Pukka' number, or the case number is given. Which means our case is now ready to be heard in the court. We then saw the Probate Department, which deals with the cases on personal and commercial wills. If we want to get a particular will executed, we have to file an application in the high court, and get a succession certificate. Only then can we get the benefits of the will.

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# REPORT ON YERVADA JAH, VISIT 08th FEB 2020

#### BACKGROUND

Reason/Objective- To provide students opportunity to visit a correctional facility to dispel any myths that have been created or fostered by the media.

#### BRIEF INTRODUCTION

On O8th Feb 2020 our day started at 6:30 am. By this time, we were expected to board the bus that was to take us to the Yerwada Central Jail, Pane. With one stoppage on the Mumbai-Pune Highway, we proceeded on our way to the jail. We reached there by Ham. Our visiting time was fixed from 11:00 am to 02:00 pm. It included the lunch break. Our bus stopped in the parking area of the Central Juil where we were given instructions to leave our gudgets and bags in the bus and only take our ID proofs with us inside the jail. We first went to the main Yerwada Jail where male prisoners are kept. The jail is fortified by high walls on each side. The outer walls being grey in colour give it a grim look. As we enter the huge gates, we form two lines. The main entry gates have the colours of blue and yellow stripes. As we enter the main set of huge gates, we are met with a set of male and female jailers. One set check each and every person in the line and the other set of juilers take charge of our group. Then we have to enter another set of gates before we get to see the inside of the jail. Though the outside of the jail with its tall wall and huge gates makes for one grim picture but the insides of the jail are another story. The Walls on the inside have been decorated with graffiti that contains inspirational quotes and drawings done by the prisoners themselves. We were first guided to the place where the famous Poona Pact was signed between Ambedkar and Gandhiji in 1932. That area has been conserved and turned into a minimize with paper cuttings of that era with the headlines about the Poona Pact. It also showcases Gundhiji's charkha.

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Then we were escuried to the kitchen area where the prisoners were preparing that day's funch for themselves. The food was quite edible. We took a round of the kitchen where we now a couple of hig machines for preparing flour dough in good quantity. Then we saw the convicted prisoners standing is a line, either dicing vegetables or making rotis.
