Admission Guidelines

GENERAL

Admission is purely on merit and is subject to availability of seats as per the directions issued by University of Mumbai and Government of Maharashtra from time to time. A transparent admission procedure is followed, strictly based on the standard norms. Any modification in admission guidelines will be notified on the college notice board at the time of admission. The management or the college does not accept any donation or capitation fee for admission to any course offered by the college. The public is cautioned not to fall a prey to any misleading information regarding admission in the college through donations.

ELIGIBILITY



Eligibility for Appearing to MAH-LL. B 5 Yrs. Integrated Course CET-2021

The candidate should be an Indian Citizen. The candidate belonging to the type [NRI, PIO, OCI and Foreign National Students] with following Academic Eligibility is not required to appear for CET Examination.

Educational Qualifications 5 Years Integrated Course

(1)(a) An applicant who has successfully completed Senior Secondary School course (+2) or equivalent (such as 11+1, A level in Senior Secondary School Leaving Certificate course) from a recognized Board/University in India or outside or from Secondary Board or equivalent, constituted or recognized by the Union or by a State Government or from any equivalent institution from a Foreign Country recognized by the Government of that Country for the purpose of issue of qualifying certificate on successful completion of the course Examination, with minimum of 45% marks in aggregate for Open and Economically Weaker Section (EWS) Category candidates and Out Side Maharashtra State Candidature Candidates (OMS) i.e. All India Candidates, (candidate belonging to SC and ST Category from the State of Maharashtra with minimum 40% Aggregate Marks and VJNT, SBC, OBC, Category belonging to State of Maharashtra with Minimum 42% Aggregate marks);

(b) The applicants who have obtained +2 Higher Secondary Pass certificate or First Degree Certificate after processing studies in Distance or Correspondence Method is eligible for admission to the course; Provided that, the applicants who have obtained 10+2 through Open (University) system directly without having any Basic Qualification (Standard X) are not eligible for LL. B- 5 Yrs. CET. Further provided that, applicants who have obtained 10th Std./Secondary Schooling Certificate Examination, in a Single Sitting Examination without having basic qualification (1st to 9th Standard of Schooling) is not Eligible for Admission. Further provided that, the candidates who are appearing / appeared for the qualifying examination (regular examination of that Academic Year) are also eligible to apply for the Entrance Examination. Such candidate will be eligible for admission only if they produce the provisional/ Degree/ certificate of the qualifying examination and the mark lists of all parts/attempts the of qualifying examination at the time of admission. Reference: 1. (Government of Maharashtra Gazette, Extraordinary, Part-IV-B, Extraordinary No. 175, Dated 04th June 2019 [Page No.23 & 24].

Educational Qualifications for LL.B. (Three Years)

(a) Candidate should be a graduate in any faculty of any University in Maharashtra established by an act of Parliament or by a State Legislature or an equivalent National Institution recognized as a Deemed to be University or Foreign University recognized as equivalent to the status of an Indian University by an authority competent to declare equivalence, With Minimum 45% of Marks in aggregate (That is 45 % marks for all the parts of the Degree Examination taken together) in qualifying examination in case of the candidates belongings to OPEN Category, ALL INDIA CANDIDATURE (OMS) & EWS candidates from the state of Maharashtra, [Candidate belonging to SC and ST Category need only 40% marks and VJNT, SBC and OBC, Category with minimum 42% marks in the qualifying examination.)

(b) An applicant who has passed the U.G degree of minimum Three Years and P.G degree of 2/3 Yrs. duration from University mentioned in (a) after processing the studies in the pattern of 10+2+3+2/3 with regular studies at secondary and higher secondary schooling. Post Graduate diploma will not be considered as Post Graduate Degree. Provided that, the applicants who have obtained +2 Higher Secondary Pass Certificate or First Degree Certificate by distance or correspondence method shall also be considered as eligible for CET of the 3 Years Law Courses. [The applicant who has passed the qualifying examination (10+2, U.G. & P.G.) in a single sitting examination without having basic qualifications of (10+2+3) is not eligible.] +2 is the Basic Qualification for LL.B.-3 Yrs. Course.

(c) Further provided that, NO candidate from the Open University having a degree contrary to the U.G.C. Act and Regulations and contrary to Rules of Legal Education shall be eligible. Further provided that, the candidates who are appearing/ appeared for the qualifying examination UG or PG regular examination of that Academic Year) are also eligible to apply for the Entrance Examination. Such candidates become eligible for admission only if they produce the provisional/Degree certificate of the qualifying examination and the mark lists of all parts of qualifying examination at the time of CAP Application form filling

ELIGIBILITY



Centralized Admission Process (CAP)

The Unaided Private Professional Educational Institution shall admit candidates through the Centralized Admission Process (CAP) as referred in sub-section (3) of section 3 of the Maharashtra Unaided Private Professional Educational Institutes (Regulation of Admission and Fees) Act, 2015. The stages of CAP shall be as stated below, -

- a. Display or publishing of Information Brochure by the Competent Authority.
- b. Filling Online Application Form by Candidate for participation in the Centralized Admission Process.
- c. Confirmation of Online Application Form and Document Verification at Facilitation Centre by the Candidate in person.
- d. Display or Publishing of provisional merit lists, submission of grievances, if any, and display or publishing of Final Merit Lists.
- e. Display of available Category wise Seats (Seat Matrix) for CAP Rounds I, II and III.
- f. Filling up and confirmation of Online Option Form having preferences of Institutions before CAP Rounds I. Candidates may fill in choice of Institutes in decreasing order of their preference as specified by Competent Authority. The option form once confirmed shall be considered for allotment in CAP Rounds I, II and III.
- g. Display of Provisional Allotment of CAP Rounds I, II and III indicating allotted institute.
- h. Reporting and accepting offered seat will be as per the allotment of the CAP Round I, II and III, by the Candidate at Reporting Centre.
- i. During the CAP, before accepting the allotted seat a candidate can opt to 'Freeze' or 'Float' the choice of academic program for subsequent round(s), if any, of seat allocation as provided below:
- a. Freeze: Candidates accept the offered seat and if they do not want to participate in any further rounds of seat allocation, such Candidates will not be considered in subsequent rounds of admission;
- b. Float: Candidates accept the offered seat and indicate that, if admission to an academic programme in any Institution of higher preference is offered, they will accept it. Else, they will continue with the currently accepted academic programme. Such Candidates will be considered in subsequent round of admission.
- c. For candidates who choose the Float option, and secures a seat of his/her choice of higher preference, then it would automatically result in the forfeiture of the seat accepted by the candidates in the earlier round;

d. Floating options will not be available to a Candidate who is admitted to his First Choice.

Fees Regulating Authority constituted Under section 11 (2) (3) (4) Of The Maharashtra Unaided Private Professional Educational Institutions (Regulation Admission & Fees) Act 2015 has approved tuition & development fees for Academic Year 2021-22 Rs. 35,000 For 3 Years Law Course And Rs .40,000 For 5 Years Law Course

LL.M Programme Eligibility

- (a) Admission of the students shall be made in accordance with the merits at the LL.M Entrance Examination and marks secured at LL.B. Degree
- (b) Candidates seeking LL.M. Admission are required to appear for the entrance conducted by TRCL. The minimum qualification for a candidate of general category applying for admission to the LL.M. Course is a LL.B. degree of University of Mumbai or a degree recognized as equivalent thereto. However, candidates belonging to reserved category may apply for LL.M. Course with a pass class.
- (c) Students wo have passed LL.B. Degree from other than Mumbai University are required to obtain Provisional Statement of Eligibility Certificate from Eligibility Section, Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Bhavan, Santazcruz (E), Vidyanagari, Mumbai-400098. Such candidates are required to pay fee for document verification as prescribed by Mumbai University from time to time for confirmation of validity of their certificates of their previous University and confirmation of eligibility to their LL.M.

MINORITY STUDENTS

The Maharashtra domiciled candidate belonging to Hindi Linguistic Minority Community, a particular Linguistic Minority Community from within the State of Maharashtra and as notified by the Government are eligible under this category (Those candidates who are claiming Minority Candidature, such candidate should have completed their SSC & HSC or equivalent qualifying examinations from the state of Maharashtra & should have Domicile Certificate from the State of Maharashtra, otherwise they cannot claim for Minority Candidature). Out Side Maharashtra State candidates are not eligible for this minority candidature. Outside Maharashtra State candidates i.e. OMS (All India candidature Candidates) should fill the CET Application form in Open Category.

PROHIBITION TO REGISTER FOR TWO REGULAR COURSES OF STUDY

" No student shall be a l l owed to simultaneously register for a law degree program with any other graduate or post graduate or certificate course run by the same or any other university or an institute for academic or professional learning excepting in the integrated degree program of the same institution. Provided that any short period part time certificate course on language, computer science or computer application of an institute or any course run by a Centre for Distance Learning of a University however, shall be accepted.'

(Rule 6, Rules of Legal Education 2008, Bar Council of India.)

ATTENDANCE

University Ordinance 6086 (Circular No. UG/01 of 2014 dated 5th May 2014):

- 1. There shall be the Attendance Committee, for smooth conduct of this ordinance, in every college / institute / Department of the University comprising of at least three members (to be nominated from other departments in case of the University Departments having less than 3 teachers), the Vice-Principal/ Senior Teacher (Convener) and at least two more teachers ensuring representation of the concerned faculties, nominated by the Principal/Director/Head.
- 2. Every bonafide learner shall ordinarily be allowed to keep terms for the given semester in a program of his

enrolment, only if he ful Ifill at least seventy five percent (75) of the attendance taken as an average of the total number of lectures, practical, tutorials etc. wherein short and/or long excursions/ field visits/study tours organized by the college and supervised by the teachers as envisaged in the syllabus shall be credited to his attendance for the total no of periods which are otherwise delivered on the material day/s. Further, it is mandatory for every learner to have min 50% attendance for each course & average attendance has to be 75%.

- 3. The same ratio shall be applied for computing the attendance of the learners by crediting the number of periods which are missed while participating i n an extracurricular / co-curricular activity / competition / camp / workshop / convention / symposium / seminar etc. where the said learner is officially representing the college / University / District / State / Country with permission of the Principal / Director / Head of the College / Institute/ University Department or by the direction of the University Officer as the case may be wherein for the purpose of computing the average attendance the periods missed for what is envisaged here-inabove, at Sr. No 2, shall be deemed to have been attended by the said learner.
- 4. Without prejudice to what is stated here-in-above, the Principal / Director / Head of the concerned College / Institute / Department of the University shall be the competent authority to condone the absentee of any learner further up to additional 25 , if deemed fit and on recommendation of the attendance committee of the said college / Institute / Department of the University, wherein it is mandatory on the said committee to do natural justice by giving personal hearing to every learner falling short of minimum attendance for keeping terms and recommending case by case to the competent authority having verified the genuineness and gravity of the problem that justifies the learner to remain absent, which generally shall be limited to his own sickness, sickness of his parent, death of his parent etc. supported by valid evidence, documentary or otherwise.

IDENTITY CARDS

Students shall keep their identity cards with them while they are in the

College premises, and shall produce it whenever required by any member of the College staff. Every student must show his identity card to the security personnel at the gate, failing which he may not be allowed to enter the college premises. Loss of identity card should be reported to the College Office. A duplicate identity card may be issued only with the permission of the Principal and on payment of Rs. 500/-.

OTHERS

Students shall abide by all general or special rules made by the college authorities regarding the conduct of the students both in and outside the college and the decision of the college authorities shall be final. Parents and guardians are also presumed to have agreed that their wards shall be bound by these rules when they join the college.

Students are required to dress decently. The students are directed, and their parents requested to ensure that in this respect they must bear in mind that the students must turn out in keeping with the serenity that one associates with an educational institution and with the one associated with law

Use of cell phones is strictly prohibited. Students found using cell phones in classes, library and in the college, premises are liable to be proceeded against.

Attendance is compulsory at all examinations and lectures, including seminars and moot court, all college events etc. The attendance and the work of the students in the seminars, classes, moot court etc. and the progress at the college examinations and their overall conduct will be taken into consideration while granting their terms and deciding their eligibility for the university examination. Conduct of the students in the class as well as in the premises of the college shall be such, as will cause no disturbance to fellow students or to other classes.

Students must not loiter about or congregate in the college premises while the classes are in progress. Students shall do nothing either inside or outside the college that will, in any way, interfere with its administration.

Students must take proper care of the college property and help in keeping the premises neat and clean. Any damage done to the property of the college will have to be compensated by the student.

In the premises of the college or in the name of the college, no Society, Association, Organization etc. shall be formed or collection be made, tickets be sold, function or meeting be held, person be invited to address students, social be arranged nor anything be printed, notice be up on the notice board nor announcements be made without the permission of the Principal.

Students should, in their own interest, read notices placed on the notice boards and website from time to time.

All meetings, functions, programmes etc. must be organized / conducted only under the supervision and control of and presided over by the Principal or by any other staff member authorized by the Principal. Students must not engage themselves in any political work in the college premises. Students should not communicate, without previous permission of the Principal, any information or write about any matter to the Press, relating to the college.

If for any reason, the continuance of a student in the college is, in the opinion of the Principal, detrimental to the best interests of discipline of the college, he may direct such student to leave the college.

Students securing admission to the college are required to abide by all the Rules, Regulations and Instructions that may be issued by the college Authorities from time to time and submit to the normal enforcement

of the same to the satisfaction of the college Authorities, whose decision in all matters shall be final and the same shall not be called in question on any ground whatsoever.

No excursions, picnics or tours can be arranged without the prior permission of the Principal. The permission may be granted, if an application is submitted by the students to the Principal through the members of the staff accompanying the students, at least one week prior to the scheduled date. The students will have to give an undertaking that they will behave properly and obey all instructions of the staff members' in-charge, going at their cost and consequences. The college will not be held responsible for any untoward incident that may happen on an excursion, a picnic or a tour. When an application for permission is submitted, it will be presumed that the students have

taken previous permission from their parents/ guardians to join the picnic

Smoking of cigarettes and other harmful products, chewing tobacco, consuming liquor or any other kind of intoxication is strictly prohibited within the premises of the college. Sale of cigarettes and other tobacco products within the radius of 100 yards of an Educational Institution is strictly prohibited and is punishable

offence under s. 24 of the Cigarettes & other Tobacco Products (Prohibition of advertisement & Regulation of Trade & Commerce, Production, Supply & distribution) Act, 2003, with a fine which may extend up to 200 rupees.

STANDARD FOR PASSING THE B.L.S. / LL..B. EXAMINATION:

Students of First Year & Second Year of B.L.S. as well as LL.B, in order to pass a course shall have to obtain a minimum of 40% marks in aggregate of Internal Assessment & Semester End Examination taken together; however the learners shall have to obtain minimum of 30% marks in the Internal Assessment (i.e. 12 out of 40) and 30% marks in Semester End Examination (i.e. 18 Out of 60) separately, to pass the course and minimum of Grade Ein each course, to pass a particular semester.

For Students of Fourth & Fifth Year of B.L.S. / LL. B & Third Year of LL.B.

R.4437: To pass the examination the candidates must obtain 45% marks in each theory paper/s and Practical/s separately. Those candidates who obtain less than 60% marks at the same sitting will be placed in Second Class. Those of the successful candidates who obtain 60% marks and more than 60% marks in all paper/s at one and the same sitting will be placed in the First Class. A candidate shall be declared "Passed" in the subjects / papers of Practical-I Training and subject / papers if he/she has secured minimum 45% of the total marks in the respective papers of Practical Training and subject / papers.

The candidates shall also be entitled to the benefit of allocable grace marks as per the University Regulations. A candidate who obtains 45% marks in Theory paper/s and Practical/s may, at his option be exempted from appearing in the paper/s and Practical/s as the case may be. No candidate will be admitted to, and allowed to appear at, the yearend

semester examinations unless he / she has successfully passed the Examination in the Practical Training papers for the respective semester to be conducted by the respective colleges affiliated to the University of Mumbai, on behalf of the University.

In accordance with the University of Mumbai Circular no. Exam / KMK / 1844 / 2018 dated 17th may, 2018, examinations of Semester I to IV of LL.B. [Three Year Course] and Semester I to VIII of B.L.S. / LL.B. [Five Year Course] will be conducted by the respective affiliated colleges on behalf of the University.

The remaining examinations i.e. sem. V & VI of LL.B. and Sem. IX and X of B.L.S. / LL.B. will be conducted by University of Mumbai.

LIBRARY WORKING HOURS

Library will remain open between 9.00 a.m. and 6.00 p.m. on all working days. The student must immediately report to the Principal through the Librarian, if he/she losses his/her Reader's Ticket. A new Reader's Ticket will be issued in place of the lost one on payment of Rs. 100/-. The detailed rules regarding the Library are available with the Librarian, on request.

REFERENCE AND STUDY ROOM SECTION

Books placed in the Reference section, such as dictionaries, encyclopedias, reports, University handbooks, question papers etc. will be issued to a student against his Identity Card only for reference in the Library. They must be returned at least fifteen minutes before the Library closes. The books thus issued must not, on any account, be taken out of the Library Hall. A fine of Rs.10/per day will be charged in case such books are taken out.

Current periodicals as well as the bound volumes of the old periodicals will be made available only for reference in the Library. Students should not remove the periodicals from their places allotted in the Library.

Students should claim back and verify their Identity Cards when they return the books.


15 DAYS DOOR TO DOOR LEGAL AID PROGRAMME:
