BACKGROUND

- **Reason/Objective-** To train students and impart skills for making para legal volunteers.
- **Conducted under-** The program was organised by the Legal Aid Committee and conducted in association with Global Care Foundation and DLSA.
- **Expected Outcome-** The expected outcome of the program was to make the students learn the work done by the NGO upskill them
- **Expected to increase-** The program aimed at increasing the interests of the students to approach the needy and helpless people of the society as effective citizens of India.

BRIEF INTRODUCTION

Thakur Ramnarayan College of Law organised a Para Legal Training program especially for its students. Outsiders were also allowed to join. It was a three day event which was meant to be held from 13th Feb. However, owing to the unavailability of the resource person it was shifted to a day later.

Post lunch sessions were on Criminal Laws and Property laws by Adv. Sohail Sharif and Adv. Sanjeev Rapolu.

On day II the matters on discussion were Pre- Conception and Pre Natal Diagnostic Techniques (Prohibition of Sex Selection) Act, 1994 by Adv. Hafsa Khan

Ms. Rukaiya Joshi introduced to the students various Government Schemes for the development of marginal sections of society.


BACKGROUND

The Guest-Speakers of the webinar were warmly welcomed by Ms. Davina David and introduced the concept of Praja Foundation.




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The webinar focused on the explanation of the following points:-



BACKGROUND

- **Reason/Objective-** Police station visit for the students was conducted as an opportunity for students to understand basic functioning of police station. Reason behind this visit was to make students understand about day to day working of police station and to introduce police station as a facility of public office.
- **Conducted under-** The visit was conducted under Legal- Aid Clinic as a part of Induction programme for F.Y.B.L.S./ LL.B.
- **Usefulness-** The program was useful for the students to enhance their interest in working of Police and understand the infrastructure of police station.
- **Expected Outcome-** At the end of the visit, it is expected that students involved in the visit will be able to understand the basic day to day working at police station and to get the minimum idea of facilities attached to and in the police station.
- **Expected to increase-** It is expected after the visit, students will be generating more interest in criminal jurisprudence and criminal justice mechanism.

BRIEF INTRODUCTION

Thakur Ramnarayan College of Law organised a Police Station visit at Dahisar Police Station with approval of and in co-ordination with Dahisar Police Station. Police station visit was scheduled at 11:00 a.m. The police station visit started at 11:00 a.m. on 19th August 2019. It was attended by 37 students of F.Y.B.L.S./ LL.B. Visit was aimed to generate interest amongst



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students as regard to police station and make them aware of basic functions of police station along with introduction of police station as a public office.

Visit was guided by Mr. Desale, a Police officer at Dahisar Police Station. It started with understanding the working of police station as in matters of language of communication and documentation in police station, introducing the various registers available at the police station, use of such register etc. Further students were taken to the Weapon Storage Room of police station and briefed about the weapons. Students have also been introduced to the Cyber Cell and Woman Cell situated inside the police station premises.


